4. Connotative language. Provide three examples of connotative language from the novel. Provide the literal meaning of the words as well as the connotative meaning. Why do you think the author chose those particular words?

5. Who is the protagonist in the novel? Who is the antagonist? Is there more than one antagonist? Why would an author want more than one antagonist in a novel?

6. What type of point-of-view does the author use? Why do you think the author chose to tell the story from this point-of-view?

7. Does the author use alliteration? Provide examples.

8. Does the author use onomatopoeia? Provide an example.
